YOUR CHILD WAS CREATED ON PURPOSE AND FOR A PURPOSE: Each person has the innate need to be part of something meaningful, something bigger than themselves. God meets that need by inviting all of us to get outside of ourselves and take part of His good work in this world. He has uniquely created each of us for an intended purpose. That is a major emphasis this year. Your child will grasp the value they have when they view themselves through this lens. Check out this dynamic version of Ephesians 2:10

"We are God's masterpiece, handcrafted by God in Christ Jesus to do His good work which he specifically prepared for us long ago."

Just as you were specifically chosen to raise your child, there is work set aside by God specifically for your kiddo. God has entrusted us with gifts, talents and time. As believers we have

the great opportunity to worship and glorify God through the spiritual discipline of service. This service is lived out in both the informal settings of everyday life at home or school, as well as specific ministry that we think God has gifted us and called us to.

LIFESTYLE OF SERVICE: All Christians are called to live a life of service. While sometimes that is reflected in more formal situations, every day offers us the opportunity to have a general attitude of service. This year, focus your family on the everyday opportunities to live out Ephesians 5:1-2:

"Be imitators of God as dearly loved children, and live a life of love, just as Jesus loved us and gave himself up for us as a sacrifice, a pleasing aroma to God."

Whether it's helping with dishes when it's not our turn because brother has a science project to do, or putting down the video game to help a neighbor shovel the snow, we have opportunities throughout this year to teach our kids that we are servants in this world. Your child might be naturally gifted to serve (Romans 12:7) as some Christians are, but all Christians are called to serve even if it's not "our gift."

FORMAL ROLES OF SERVICE: Beyond the expectation that all Christians are marked by servant attitudes, the Holy Spirit has gifted each one of us with a special gift that contributes to the body. There are tools that can help us discover our unique gifts and explore how we might use those gifts to glorify Him, like the Assessing Your Child's Spiritual Gifts tool included in this booklet. You can also discover your gift by trying a variety of ways to serve and paying attention to what you are good at and what brings you joy. Finally, we can listen to the people in our lives. For example, many preachers have stories where as a child, someone told them that they thought God was going to make them into a preacher someday. The church's affirmation is a great way to find your giftedness.

ENGAGE THEIR INTERESTS: You'll notice that the one-word parenting plan for this age group on our PHASE TRI-FOLD that comes with this packet is ENGAGE. At this point in your child's life, he or she might change their minds a lot about what they like and what they want to grow up to become. She might be planning to spend her life as a dancer in the morning, a veterinarian by the afternoon, and an

artist by bedtime. He might want to do nothing but build things with Legos, or talk about sports or books. Don't grow weary in listening and asking questions, treating these conversations with tremendous wonder and curiosity. Showing interest in their interests will help you bond and increase their trust in you. ENGAGE their interests by getting involved with them. This applies to serving too!

MODEL SERVICE: You might need to resolve to become better about serving in your life this year as well. If you typically don't pitch in and help your spouse much, this is the year to get better at that so that your kids see a servant's attitude in you. If you're not currently serving in some role at church, pray for God to help you find a good place to serve that fits you well. Model what you are teaching your child this year, and it's more likely it will stick.











SERVING SUGGESTIONS

long with Ephesians 2:10 and 5:1-2, teach your children Galatians 5:13, or a portion of it really... "serve one another in love." You could print it out and hang it on your fridge, or write it with a dry erase marker on your bathroom mirror. Refer to it often. Frankly, kids sometimes have a harder time serving people in their own family, over serving people who don't live with them. But this year, make it a personal mission to work through some of the attitude struggles we have with siblings serving siblings, or kids pitching in around home. It will benefit not only your family now, but it will impact the way they serve their own future spouse and children.

UNDER THE RADAR: If your child is resistant to this year's focus, you might have greater success teaching your child to serve others in his family by not putting them on the spot. Have quiet conversations where you ask them to do something nice for the family (for example, helping a sibling clean up a mess they didn't make), but don't do it in front of the family. This will allow you to do any heart-work without the added pressure of an audience. Hopefully after a year of focus on this, your child will have begun to initiate more of this on his own. Occasionally reward your child, but do not do it every time or the ambition for her service might change to a more selfish motive. Make sure to give your child plenty of opportunities and praise for growth.

BIRTHDAY COUPONS: For birthdays this year, consider having the kids give "serving" coupons to family members for their birthdays. These can be as simple as "substitute for your turn of one night of dishes" or "make your bed for 3 days."

OUTSIDE THE HOME: Make memories this year by serving outside of the home as a family. These can be fun occasions and teach valuable lessons: rake an elderly person's yard together (don't take \$!); leave secret gifts for a needy family on their porch, knock on the door and run!; volunteer at a 5k or charity event together; host an international student for dinner; babysit for an adoptive or foster family; secretly wash a neighbor's car early in the morning and then go get donuts; pass out smiles and flowers at a nursing home; make dinner for a family with a newborn; or send care packages to soldiers or college students.

IDEAS FOR SERVING AS A FAMILY AT EASTVIEW: This year, as you focus on serving, consider having a family meeting to kick the year off and have a brainstorming session on ways your family can serve at church. Below are some ideas to make some memories while making an impact on the heart of your child.

- Serving Opportunities For Your Child As a nine year old, there are places your child can serve on his own at Eastview. He can serve on an arts team like drama, choir, sound and lights or art. To get more information on that email Maggie at mhundley@eastview.church. Each grade level has opportunities to serve in their own area on Sundays some opportunities are for the service they attend, and some are for during a service where he is not actually in the service (this works well if you are serving one service/attending the other service too). Talk to your child's pastor to get more information.
- Seize the Moments at Eastview Whether it's our quarterly food drives, Imagine, cleaning days, etc. use the various all-church initiatives as opportunities to engage your children. As you take them to help you do the shopping for a food drive, for example, you are building memories and important lessons in their hearts.

- **Pitching In** Throughout this year, look for opportunities as a family to pitch in when you can with informal opportunities for serving. For example, after a church function, stick around and help clean up and put things away. After Sunday service, go through the hallways and pick up trash. Show up on a Saturday for an hour and help clean up litter or weeds. Help the kids to see the church as "our church." Help them develop ownership and to build a mindset of being a servant.
- Family Missions Trip There are options available for families to take an international missions trip. For more information, stop by the Missions kiosk on the upper level or check out upcoming trips at www.eastview.church/ outreach/global.

ASSESSING YOUR CHILD'S SPIRITUAL GIFTS

Spiritual Gifts Assessment Tool ©Inkling Innovations and Lydia Randall

You can help your child identify, develp and use the gifts God has given them from an early age.

Each of you should use whatever gift you have received to serve others, as faithful stewards of God's grace in it's various forms.

1st Peter 4:10 NIV

You may choose to complete this assessment with your child or answer the questions knowing what is true about them. You can also invite other family members to assess the child since various people may perceive different gifts in action.

TO GET STARTED:

Pray: Ask the Lord for wisdom and guidance before you take the assessment.

Reassure: Tell your child this is just a tool, not a test. There are no right or wrong answers.

Observe: This assessment can help you begin the process of discovering gifts and guiding your child. You may find new gifts as your child matures and encounters new experiences and opportunities to serve others.

J = Mercy (Caring for hurting/suffering people)

K = Pastor/Shepherd (Caring for another person's spiritual well-being)

L = Helping (Doing what needs to be done behind the scenes)

M = Teaching (Explaining God's truth in a way people can understand)

N = Wisdom (Applying God's principles to real-life situations)

NOW WHAT?

- 1. Use the results to help your child find opportunities to serve God by using his or her gifts. Based on the nature of their gifts, these opportunities might be at church, at home, at school or some type of informal role.
- Come up with 2-3 ideas of how your child can serve others using his or her top gifts. Teach them that unlike a birthday gift, a spiritual gift is one that is given to someone in order to give it away to others.
- 3. Pay attention and encourage your child when you see him or her living out specific spiritual gifts. Affirmation will play a large role in their discovery of what God has made them. Now, that doesn't mean to mislead them by telling them they are wonderful at things they really aren't. But it is important for you to recognize and affirm their attempt at serving God with their gifts. Just as with most things in life, we get better at things with time and maturity. This applies to our spiritual gifts as well. Paul tells Timothy to fan his gift into flame. Help your child develop their gifts by coaching them as they experiment with different opportunities.

- 4. Continue to test the results as your child grows and matures in his or her faith adventure. This gift assessment is only a tool to get things started, and NOT meant to be the definitive path for life. Many people discover different gifts as they grow in their relationship with Jesus.
- 5. Remind your child that he or she was created by God for a specific purpose. Reinforce Ephesians 2:10 all year this year. Even as they are entering adolescence, remind them of the significance they have as God's special creation by keeping this verse in front of them. Put it up in their room, quote it often and let them know how proud you are of them for doing God's good work in this world.

YOUR CHILD IS GOD'S MASTERPIECE

phesians 2:10 tells us that we are all handcrafted masterpieces of God created to do something specific in this world, something that God prepared long ago for us to do. That is such a significant thing in your child's life. Reinforce this truth constantly throughout their life. Every person needs to realize how valuable they are. Your kids need to know that they are a part of something bigger than themselves, that they have a purpose for being here. As the leader of your family, invite your spouse and your children to be a part of something big. Set your family "on mission" in this world and find out what specifically God has created you to do for Him. A simple daily prayer can be something like, "God, please use our family to do your good work in this world."

FUN WAYS TO IMPRESS EPHESIANS 2:10 ON YOUR CHILD'S HEART

Work with your child to memorize this verse throughout the year.

There are a lot of fun ideas to be creative with it, but here are a few suggestions to get you started.

RACE THE CLOCK: If your child likes competition, write each word of the verse on an index card. Make a set for each person in the family. Shuffle the cards. On "go" race to see who can put their set in order first. At first, give them a paper with the verse on it so they can reference it. After a while, take that away.

BACK AND FORTH: Sit in circle and read the verse. Then go around the circle, each person saying the next word in the verse. Let everyone see the verse for a while, but eventually, take the verse away and see if you can make it through the whole verse as a family.

DISAPPEARING WORDS: Write the verse on a white board, window or mirror with a dry erase marker. Have everyone read the verse. Without them looking, erase some words. Then have them read the verse again, filling in the missing words. Repeat this until all the words are gone and they have the verse memorized.

HAVE IT SHOW UP...EVERYWHERE! Consider making this verse a part of your home décor. Or write it on the bathroom mirror with dry erase marker. Put it on notes in their lunch or on their pillows. Use this verse as you pray for your child before bed, keeping a copy of it in their room.

If you haven't already, you need to make sure that every device in your family is protected. Having unprotected devices in your home would be as if our parents had left explicit magazines lying around the house, expecting us to make good choices.

3 STEPS TO PROTECTING YOUR CHILD ONLINE

- 1. Talk to your child about using their devices. Discuss how they should never give out personal information or chat with strangers. Have an age-appropriate conversation about pornography. Stress how important it is to let you know if they come across inappropriate content. Make sure they know you are a safe person to talk to about what they've seen. For help in talking with kids about pornography, check out Good Pictures/Bad Pictures and Good Pictures/Bad Pictures Jr. by Kristen Jenson, M.A. and Gail Poyner, PhD. There are also great resources at family.org and covenanteyes.com.
- Set boundaries for internet usage. Require that all
 internet usage be done in a central area of the house
 where parents and other family members will be. Do not
 allow surfing while you are not home, including homework
 which typically requires a lot of need for google images.

- Do not allow devices in a child's room they should not need privacy to be on the internet.
- 3. Protect your devices with a content blocker and report generator. There are several companies that provide these services/software. Focus on the Family partners with Net Nanny and Forcefield. Covenant Eyes is used by many families at Eastview. These programs will not only block content, but will also send accountability reports on everyone's usage in the family. You should also go into the settings of each device and determine the restrictions for that device, which is then protected by a 4 digit PIN.

Commit yourself to being intentional about being a gatekeeper for your child's heart and mind - no apologies. It will be impossible to protect them entirely, but these simple steps are a good start toward giving them a good shot at never knowing the dark world of a porn addiction.

THIS YEAR'S MARRIAGE PLAN

ach year we want to encourage you to make a plan to keep your marriage healthy. One of the most important gifts you'll give to your child is the love you give to your spouse. When mom and dad love each other and demonstrate the traits of a healthy (NOT PERFECT!) marriage, it not only sets a good example of a godly marriage, but gives them a greater sense of security and well-being. Andy Stanley in The Principle of the Path writes "We don't drift to good places." (Thomas Nelson, 2008). Good marriages require intentionality. Use the plan below to make an intentional effort in your marriage this year. Read The Best Us by Ted Lowe (©MarriedPeople 2016) for a full explanation of Have Serious Fun! Love God First; Respect and Love; Practice Your Promise.

Have Serious Fun! Date Night Scheduling: Grab your calendars and mark at least TWO date nights for each month and PROTECT those dates. Remember that you were boyfriend and girlfriend before you were dad and mom, and have fun together! No family administration discussions! For extra fun, watch for sponsored "Date Nights" by Eastview's Marriage Ministry. Each date night, you swing by the church to recieve your plans for the evening.

Love God First - Faith Practices 101: Research finds that couples who pray together at least twice a week have a divorce rate of less than 1% (HomePointe). Commit to praying as a couple at least twice a week. Plan which worship service the two of you will attend together each week – don't "divide and conquer" in order to volunteer.

Love and Respect - Write an Annual Letter: Write a letter to your spouse for your anniversary this year, much like the one in this booklet that you will write to your child. Write a letter of memories from this past year, affirmations, prayers and promises to each other.

Practice Your Promise - Personal Growth: Set a "secret goal" to grow as a spouse, such as "listening better," "praising her in public," or "initiating romance." Write it down and seal it in an envelope or save it on your phone. When you receive next year's booklet, open the envelope or file and assess your progress.

Invest In Your Marriage: Join an email blog like lesandleslie.com, choose one book to read this year, or choose a small group study on marriage. The Eastview Family Resource Center, Eastview Marriage Ministry and RightNow Media have many helpful events and resources.


