- describes Jesus's teaching.
- 3. During week 2 of this study we learned that 1 John 4:19-21 refocuses us on caring for one another. But there's more to this passage. This time, let's look at it from the vantage point of living on mission.
 - What does this passage teach us about living on mission? What is challenging or encouraging about this?
- 4. A vibrant community that cares and enjoys one another is primed to live on mission. Let's go back again to Acts 2:42-47. This passage demonstrates what everyday, intentional living on mission can be like.
 - What did this group of people commit themselves to do?
 - How did this group of people grow?
 - What were the impacts of their everyday actions?
 - How can you apply this to your group's community and mission?

WITH PRACTICE:

Some of Jesus's last words to his people were, "Go and make disciples of all nations." (Matthew 28:18-20). The word "go" can easily be dismissed to be a suggestion for only a few specifically called ones to go a long way off as missionaries, but the reality of this word implies that each of us, "as we go, wherever we go" are to live on mission. You are encouraged as a group to work through this missional practice every time you meet.

- **Enjoy:** Recall something you were thankful for from this past week.
- Care: How can you care for one another this week?
- **Serve:** Pray and ask the Holy Spirit to reveal a specific name you could specifically serve? What is one way you can bless or serve that person?
- Love: How can you practice agape love and hospitality with this person?
- **Follow Jesus:** When you are with this person, how might you share your Jesus story or learn more about this person's story?
- **Obey the Holy Spirit:** Before you meet with this person, ask the Holy Spirit to guide your words and actions.
- Live on Mission: Follow through with whatever you are prompted to do.
 After interacting with this person, find another natural way to follow up with them.


Share all of this with a group member and ask them to hold you accountable to follow through. Close your gathering by praying Romans 15:13 over everyone.

Leader's Corner

This entire resource was created to focus us on the mission of "Love My Community." By now we hope you and your group have caught the vision.
